Bert is head push in Winnipeg, he has been on tour of the T.V. stations out West, Edmonton, Calgary, Regina, etc. Bruce Lehman said he got a letter from you, Bruce Ferguson, was asking for you, Fred, was in here last night aslso asking for you. I am not getting much supply work, no car is a big shut-off there. I preached here on Sept.5th. on the theme, "The Winner is Dressed in White " Rev. 3:5. and again at Courtland on Oct. 10th. Theme, for Harvest Home, "A Harvest from a Handful " Psalm 72:16.
