loan them millions to meet their liabilities. England in Feb.or
March, would not be much to look at, and you have interests there
which are more important than seeing your Mother here. I think
speed is the chief urge for you at this time. Now that we know you are coming home, we can save you the expense of cables, or
telegraph, or other swift messages, Come swiftly yourself.

Christmas was spent here just two of us, alice Bert, and Judith came on a flying visit of two hours on the 23rd dev. of course they had their Christmas plans for a home Christmas.

The Church people brought us a nice watm Christmas dinner, on the 25th, which we enjoyed very much. We have not been to church for about 4 Sundays, because of your Mother's illness, and we will not be at church to-morrow, your Mother is not at all well, has to be watch all the time, It is about Bath time now so I will stop writing and see that all is going right.
