Dear Evelyn & Co. p. 3  
Your letter of Nov 8 - 9th arrived at Nhill  
just two days before I left there on the 22th. aboard the 4:50  
ton "Malahena" on the 10 day, 450 mile plantation to plantation  
Broken Bays. (packing up a full load of eggs, & some sea shell  
- Trunks shell for better makings as well as some cocoa) - to Rabaul  
It was one step up from the 23 ton "Malahena" on which I  
had begun my "evacuation" of our base parts. Somehow I  
am disinclined to provide all over again. The details of the last  
two months (since I wrote to you on 3/9/56 last) at Nhill - tho'  
the brief generalization that they were better would be most accurate  
- such impression was intensified by the sense that had been growing  
upon me that all my work was as futile. Tho' I had all nations  
and vehicles going - I had been straggled at the best by the failures  
to effectually repair the 10 year old worn surplus tires on the trucks  
killed by miles & miles of my time & the boys had been wasted in  
the vain effort to repair them - of the 5 trucks on the more recently  
re-ordered Ford V8 trucks - 3 were hopelessly blown out when I  
left - and the "love child" Dodge on which I had lavished such  
"rhetorical" manipulation, was having flats & blowouts at the rate  
of 15 per 20 road miles to four sections (30 miles). All this  
was but superficial effect of the £ 4000 out in expenses. The Mission  
Board had ordered that year (from a total expenditure necessary of  
20 or 30, thousand pounds) This instance is a direct reflection of  
the fall in incomes from N.Z. Church congregations, caused by  
the fact that people have less money than in the old days.  
"Credit squeeze" of the Banking System. - The same thing only with  
a more judiciously applied, is what caused the Stock market crash  
of 1929 which most people think of - as the start of the great  
depression. That squeeze is why the 1 1/2 Billion Dollar worth of  
world debt is causing hardship among western Canadian farmers  
including E.W.L. & A.E.L. - not to mention the increasing costs that  
those at 133 East St. Dalby, must now bear (taxes & living). Equally  
in Australia, it is the cause of the current fever about a £ 7 million deficit

② which the State owned railways (with their 3 or 4 different  
track gauges (width of r.r. tracks) over the country - such idiocy)  
have chalked up & threaten to do again. Here it can be accurately  
calculated that indirect & indirect taxes, 1/2 of the average Australian  
income goes to payment of Bank loan interest & capital repayment.  
In Canada the figure is much the same. It is a depressing fact  
that this policy of legalized robbery is accepted & payment of  
taxes regarded as almost a righteous duty - all to the power  
& profit of a tiny section of the community at large. Not only  
tho' Social Credit seem to be on the decline, but it has had  
& is having the full power of financially purchased legislation,  
blackmail & sponsored "ignorance of," opposition by the Inter-  
national Banking System, as well as by Communism & Socialism.  
All this because Social Credit is the means by which Christianity  
can crush the last bastion of evil that has withstood 1900 years  
of Christendom. Unmistakably my efforts at writing about  
Social Credit are not forgotten - The enthusiasm has led me to acquire  
the much a forehand knowledge of the situation on the part of my  
readers. I forget that I had a year or so of private reading  
in the interim during which to scull over & fix these ideas  
in my head. However more recently I've a few articles about

Now a day I feel so strongly about what I say - that must be  
some intensity of expression in my tone, cause I have held all eyes  
while I've spoken. Then besides all that, after the lack of intellect

spiritual force (occasionally sporting spiritual intelligence)

& embark again on the 6000 ton Bulolo, for the very trip to  
Espira (at the high rate of \$60) Sonorai Island, Port Moresby -  
Cape Hill Town of Papua - New Guinea - then Brisbane Aust. were  
the interior parts of call. In Brisbane, I did considerable window  
shopping, and actually did buy a photo - enlarging book - and then  
after having been told by everyone that it wouldn't be done, found  
a typewriter for less than £10. (\$20) It was (was) a little old  
Corona - the same as the one Father & then Alice had, in reasonably  
good shape complete with case. The ribbon was pretty well  
worn out but by cutting out the middle part and  
just now inking the ribbon with some rubber stamp  
pad ink I've been able to get a fairly good im-  
pression. The stamp pad ink I've had for about 3  
years or more ever since the gift of a rubber stamp  
by Father necessitated it. Of course the typewriter  
was for the purpose of allowing the Folks to read  
my letters more readily./////The reoperation of  
the Panther has been my main job these days, after  
delaying from 21st. to the 2nd. waiting for the  
cartage co'y. to deliver my tools to the storage  
garage. However now after a bit over a week the bad  
part of the job is over and today I should be abl

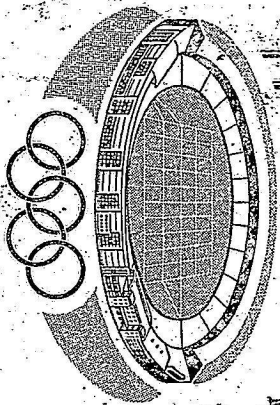
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to hear the engine go again with

When I first started it up I was greatly pleased to have it, (the beast—a Panther of course) leap up with a roar or should it be a snarl after only a couple of kicks.
